'Taejongdae Ocean Flying Theme Park' Opened

It will be a new milestone for Yeongdo, offering a competitive edge in culture and tourism

Equipped with experiential culture-spaces complex such as zip wires, media art, and cafes

Official operation in December after the opening ceremony on November 29 and pilot operations

Taejongdae Ocean Flying Theme Park, an experiential tourism facility where you can enjoy the beautiful natural scenery of Taejongdae and the sound of fresh waves, will open on November 29. Taejongdae Ocean Flying Theme Park, which will be priming water for the revitalization of the stagnant Taejongdae tourism business, is a culture-facility complex equipped with zip wires, media art, and a view cafe, and is already expected to be a new landmark in Yeongdo District.

Yeongdo District purchased the land of Taejong-dae Jungrisan Mountain, the vicinity of the former JayuLand parking lot of the Ministry of National Defense, Busan City, and built upper stop (55 Marine Healing Road, 1 basement floor, 4 above-ground floors, 646 m² total floor area) and lower stop (55 836 beon-gil Taejong-Ro, 3 above-ground floors with 1 basement floor, 744 m² total floor area); the construction took one year and seven months. It is getting ready to welcome tourists: to operate it professionally and manage it efficiently, it selected private operators through open bidding for the operating permit in September.

First of all, at the upper stop, there is a view cafe where you can enjoy the view of the open sea; there are four zip lines spanning 653m from Mount Jungrisan~Gamji Beach~former JayuLand Parking Lot. At the lower stop, you can meet the zip wire arrival hall and media art where you can watch images implemented on LED screens based on digital media technology.

In particular, Taejongdae Ocean Flying Theme Park, located on the Taejongdae Coastal Tourism Connection Road, tourists can enjoy beautiful natural scenery comfortably. The tourists visiting Taejongdae will be able to encounter thrilling experiences and cultural content together, breaking away from existing sightseeing tours.

The user fee for zip wire is 30,000 won (single day, one pass); Media is art 10,000 won for

adults, 8,000 won for youths, and 5,000 won for children; the residents of Yeongdo District receive a 30% discount.

Yeongdo Mayor of Gu said, "Taejongdae Ocean Flying Theme Park will be a new milestone for the tourism of Yeongdo, represented by Taejongdae." and "As a cultural facility complex with contents linking culture and tourism, I hope you can get out of your tired daily life for a while and fully enjoy differentiated memories and pleasures that you cannot experience in existing tourist facilities."

Meanwhile, Taejongdae Ocean Flying Theme Park will hold an opening ceremony at its lower stop on November 29 and will officially begin operation in December after supplementing improvements in operating services.

The Demonstration Project to Revitalize the Old Industrial Area in Yeongdo passed the preliminary feasibility study





As the 「Demonstration Project to Revitalize Old Industrial Area in Yeongdo」 passed the preliminary feasibility study of the Ministry of Economy and Finance (hereinafter referred to as Preliminary Feasibility Study), the foundation for the North Port's three-stage port redevelopment project and the Yeongdo YoungBlueBelt development project were laid in earnest.

The 「Demonstration Project to Revitalize Old Industrial Area in Yeongdo」 was selected as a pilot site for the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, and Transport in 2019, and the Korea Land and

Housing Corporation (hereinafter referred to as LH) secured the site early through the Land Reserve Project in 2021, paving the way for the project to be implemented.

The pilot project site is the site of the (former) Hankook Tire Busan plant (A=89,578 m²) located in Cheonghak-dong, Yeongdo District, and is included in the North Port 3rd stage of the Port Redevelopment Zone. It is also a key site that serves as an anchor for the regeneration project of old industrial areas located in Cheonghak-dong Dongsam-dong (construction of the YeongBlueBelt, about 500,000 m²). Through the promotion of the Demonstration Project to Revitalize Old Industrial Area in Yeongdo and by creating a new maritime industrial base that combines industry housing commerce culture and waterfront facilities, it is expected to serve as a priming-water function for the success of the Yeongdo Young-BlueBelt project as well as the early implementation of the North Port 3rd stage Port Redevelopment Project.

The passage of the Preliminary Feasibility Study is all the more significant in that it has been achieved in the difficult economic conditions of Yeongdo, where industrial areas are idling and population decline is rapidly progressing due to the stagnation of major industries such as shipbuilding, etc.

The joint implementers, LH, Busan City, and Yeongdo District, have been pushing for the Preliminary Feasibility Studies since the end of 2021, but they have been delayed due to idle surrounding industrial areas such as its major industry ship-

building and a lack of demand for industrial and commercial facilities due to the decline in the population of the original downtown area. As a result of their active joint efforts to attract businesses, and secure insufficient industrial demands, the three organizations succeeded in attracting businesses (MOUs) and passed the Preliminary Feasibility Studies; tenant companies in the Knowledge Industry Center (nine businesses, four associations), coffee (20 businesses), culture (Mana Group), etc.

With this pilot project as a starting point, and by linking it with the North Port 3rd Stage Port Redevelopment Project and the YoungBlueBelt construction project, it is expected to be a turning point in blocking the population decline and the relocation of industrial facilities from the region. Busan City, along with LH, will complete the site preparation and start the procedure for parceling out in 2027; administrative procedures such as implementation design and industrial innovation zoning will be implemented by 2024 and the construction will begin in 2025.

Since June last year, the city and LH have been promoting the "Yeongdo YoungBlueBelt Creation Project Master Plan Service." in parallel with the Preliminary Feasibility Studies of the pilot project. This is expected to create an efficient business environment and create an economic effect of the influx of population by presenting standards (guidelines) for inducing private development such as preventing the reckless development of the YoungBlueBelt, industrial restructuring and converting industries, and providing support for tenant businesses.

Eight more caravans were added at the Yeongdo Marino Auto Camping Ground It is scheduled to open in December after a trial operation in November





Eight additional caravans, for six people, have been added to the site of the event square in the Yeongdo Marino Auto Camping Ground.

The Yeongdo Marino Auto Camping Ground, built in the space below the Yeongdo entry and exit ramp of the Busan Port Bridge (vicinity of 330-119 Cheonghak-dong), and consists of a total of 67 camping lots (15 caravans, 40 auto lots, and 12 general lots), including the newly added caravans.

The newly added caravans can be reserved by bidding in November and on a first-come, first-served basis; reservations can be made through the website of the Yeongdo Marino Auto Camping Ground.

Initially, caravans were not included in the Yeongdo-Gu residents draw, but from the December reservation, a total of three caravans, one for four people and two for six people, were reflected in the draw.

The Yeongdo-Gu Residents' bidding will be held between 14:00 of the 1st day and 14:00 of the 3rd day of every month (Results: 10:00 of the 4th day) and the general public's bidding will be held between 14:00 of the 5th day and 14:00 of the 9th day of every month (Results: 10:00 of the 10th day). The remaining, on a first-come, first-served basis reservations, will start at 14:00 on the 11th day of every month.

The newly added caravans will be fully operational in December after ironing out the problems through trial operations in November: we started the implementation design service in April of this year and completed the construction at the end of October.

Prepare for year-end tax adjustment, donate hometown love to Yeongdo, and receive tax credits and gifts in return!

Full tax credit on less than 100,000 won, 16.5% deduction on exceeding amount Additional return gifts equivalent to 30% of the donation

As the year-end tax settlement period nears, the "Hometown Love Donation Program," which allows people to receive tax credits and receive local specialty goods, is drawing attention. The "Hometown Love Donation Program", implemented on January 1, 2023, is a system that receives tax credits and return gifts when individuals donate a certain amount to local governments, excluding their current address, with a limit of 5 million won per year.

A donor can receive a full tax credit of up to 100,000 won and a 16.5% tax credit on the amount exceeding 100,000 won, as well as an additional return gift amounting to 30% from the receiving local government. Currently, the four return gift items offered by our district are \$\times\$ Coffee (Cafe 385, Coffee Discovery), \$\times\$ Bakery items (Café 385), \$\times\$ Fish cake (Samjin Food), and \$\times\$ Service coupons (Piak, Bongsan village).

There are two ways to donate: a donor needs to visit NH Non-ghyup Bank and fill out a written request for a deposit 'Gohyangsarang eEM; HometownLove eUm'or through the website (https://ilovegohyang.go.kr/). However, corporations and organizations cannot donate.

Implemented the marine-maker career camp to receive a positive response



Yeongdo District, on November 4 and 5, implemented the Marine Leisure Tourism Industry Future-Talent-Training Program (Marine-Maker Career Camp), for 17 elementary and middle school students from the district, in the vicinity of Korea Maritime & Ocean University.

This is a program, a project for the Yeong-

do-Gu Hope Education District, designed to provide young people with marine career experiences using the university's infrastructure; the Korea Maritime & Ocean University LINC 3.0 Project Group the Marine Leisure Tourism Industry ICC.

In this program, students took part in maker education where they designed fabricated the University's training ship using the 3D printer and coding programs education. On board the ship Hanaro, the symbol of the Korea Maritime and Ocean University, they experienced various activities such as onboard experiential learning, a special lecture on marine career paths, and the simulation operations of the ship Hanaro.

Follow the vaccination sanitation recommendation compliance to prevent respiratory infectious diseases

The Yeongdo-Gu Public Health Center confirmed the increasing trend of respiratory patients due to a decrease in quarantine rules and sudden temperature changes as COVID-19 shifted to level 4 of legal communicable diseases, and urged proper implementation of preventive measures.

In particular, "Paroxysmal cough" whooping cough, which has recently been on the rise, has a high risk of infection among children living in groups who have not received additional vaccinations. Although a total of five whopping cough vaccination shots (DTaP) should be administered by the age of six and the 6th shot should be administered at the age of 11~12, the vaccination rate of the 5th~6th shot is relatively low (based on the results of the Vaccination Confirmation Project for elementary middle school students in 2022).

In addition, there have been many measles patients worldwide recently. As the number of overseas travelers increases, it is recommended to visit a medical institution when suspected measles symptoms such as fever and rash occur after visiting a measles outbreak region. In particular, you should check whether you have completed both vaccinations (MMR) before traveling abroad, and if you are not vaccinated uncertain, you should complete two vaccinations (at least four weeks apart) four to six weeks before departure.

An official at the Yeongdo-Gu Health Center emphasized "Infectious diseases with available vaccination shots should be inoculated in advance. When you notice suspected symptoms, you should wear a mask, practice thorough hand washing, ventilate periodically, manage diet, and exercise regularly to improve immunity."

Yeongdo, a moving welfare city enjoyed by everyone 14th Welfare Nuri Fair (Welfare Universe Fair) Held

On November 11, the Yeongdo District held the '14th Yeongdo-Gu Welfare Nuri Fair' at Amir Park in Dongsam-dong. Under the theme of "Yeongdo, a moving welfare city enjoyed by everyone", 20 social welfare facilities and related organizations in the district had time to introduce institutions and took part in hands-on activities. In particular, this year, to integrate similar welfare events, the 2023 Busan Welfare Month Ceremony and the General Social Welfare Center Performance Report were held in parallel.

In addition, the promotion booth attracted attention by promoting services in various areas such as the children youth, families, disabled, elderly, and local welfare.

In addition, a flea market with residents and a children's air bounce playground were included as side events, making it a fair for all residents to enjoy and participate together.

Name Son Ok-ryeong

I am also a first-grader.

Hello. My name is Son Ok-ryeong from China. I have been in Korea for ten years. As I was getting used to living in Korea, I was having difficulty with my job in Korea. I have been working as a lecturer to introduce my country and now I am working as a culture-tourism commentator of Yeongdo, too. Let me introduce my job for a moment: I introduce the culture of Yeongdo and introduce my Yeongdo story and nature to tourists. With the help of these various jobs, I had a time at the Yeongdo-Gu Fam-

ily Center to introduce my job to married immigrants who came to Korea like me and talk about life in Korea. At first, I thought, "Since I give a lot of talks as a lecturer and commentate on tourism, I can readily introduce to married immigrants, can't I?" As the time to talk in front of an audience as an instructor nears, I was very nervous and wanted to give more information that would help with life in Korea.

And it's time to reflect on myself once again. As I thought about how I became a lecturer, people who came to listen to my story also said that they asked, "Can I get a job like that?" the most. At first, I also had a hard time because I botched numerous job interviews. I thought "It's hard for a foreigner to have a job in Ko-

rea." However, I was able to give myself confidence as I work as a multicultural instructor and interpreter by using my strength of being able to speak various languages; I was able to gain more confidence while giving lectures.
